




## LEGACY, PREPARATION, TEACHING, AND LEADERSHIP: AN INVITATION TO CONVERGE

# RESEARCH: AN ECOSYSTEM THAT WILL ENHANCE THE IMPACT OF THE CONGRESS

The research initiatives undertaken by PUCV represent a significant asset for the Congress venue. The institution occupies a distinguished position among national universities, attributable to the exceptional capabilities of our faculty in generating, applying, transferring, and disseminating knowledge across a variety of areas of expertise. In the previous year, PUCV successfully implemented 322 national and international research projects, resulting in the publication of over 1,400 indexed scientific articles.



### DIALOGUE AND TRANSFORMATION: CONNECTING WITH THE ENVIRONMENT AS A STRATEGIC AXIS

The University fosters connections with the external environment through strategic partnerships, public service initiatives, and the cultivation of meaningful, ongoing interactions with key stakeholders across public, private, and social sectors. These horizontal and bidirectional collaborations serve to enhance the quality and relevance of its fundamental functions, including teaching and research. Engaging with the community, as a facilitator of dialogue with society, positions PUCV as a vital partner within the Chilean educational system, addressing critical challenges aimed at improving both quality and equity for all students.



### PREPARING TEACHERS AND ENHANCING THEIR WORKPLACES

Preparing teachers is a key component of the PUCV mission. For the last 76 years, PUCV has prepared teachers for all of the school's curricular areas, graduating on average 512 beginning teachers each year. This contribution to the educational system is strengthened through our graduate programs in mathematics education and science education, as well as through three research and development centers.

Líderes Educativos PUCV, the central PUCV entity submitting this bid, has a recognized track record in research and capacity building for educational leadership at the national level. Since 2005, it has promoted pioneering initiatives in this field, including innovative preparation programs for schools, pre-school centers, and district-level leaders. During the periods 2016-2019 and 2020-2024, PUCV led a consortium of Chilean Universities that created two School Leadership Centers funded by the Ministry of Education: Líderes Educativos (Educational Leaders) and C Líder: Centro Asociativo para el Liderazgo Educacional (Associative Center for Educational Leadership). Through this partnership with the Ministry of Education and school districts, we have contributed to the implementation of the national policy for Strengthening Educational Leadership.

Additionally, we have conducted research and implemented interventions on school networks, teacher leadership, and school improvement.

With over 25 years of experience, Costadigital has developed pedagogical models, learning platforms, and digital educational resources that have implemented nationwide at various levels of the school system. Costadigital's expertise is evident in the implementation of far-reaching initiatives aimed at capacity building in the Chilean school system for using information technologies in teaching and learning. Throughout its history, it has developed initial and ongoing professional development programs for over 100,000 teachers and provided technical assistance to more than 2,000 schools nationwide. This work has been carried out within the framework of strategic programs of the Ministry of Education, such as the Enlaces Program, CONICYT's Explora Program, and actions promoted by the CPEIP.

**EduInclusiva** is a research center with a primary objective of developing transdisciplinary research on the individual, organizational, and policy-level factors necessary for achieving quality inclusive education. The center supports public policies through evidence-based interventions and strategies for inclusive education, and fosters advanced human capital for research in inclusive education.



# THE TRANSFORMATIVE ROLE OF TEACHERS IN THE RAPIDLY CHANGING CONTEMPORARY EDUCATIONAL LANDSCAPE

Attaining the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030 requires a collaborative international effort, facilitated through organizations such as the International Society for the Advancement of Teacher Training (ISATT). Achieving high-quality teaching for all students and favorable working conditions for educators are increasingly challenged by a multitude of factors, including the rapid disruption of technologies -especially artificial intelligence-, erosion of democracy, escalating social fragmentation, and displacement caused by conflict and climate change, all of which are compounded by a shortage of qualified teachers. These challenges also underscore the transformative roles of educators and the educational systems in which they work, to build a sustainable, just, inclusive, and equitable society.

In this era of uncertainty and rapid change, the efforts of teachers individually and collectively have the potential to drive innovations that effectively respond to students' needs as they negotiate and navigate the changing circumstances of the first quarter of the 21st century and beyond. The ISATT 2027 conference is envisioned as a platform for international collaboration through the dissemination of rigorous research, the exchange of innovative practices and research methodologies, and the exploration of the future of teaching and the teaching profession.

The ISATT 2027 conference will investigate the dynamic interplay between continuity and change in educators' work, identities, and professional lives. It seeks to interrogate how educators and the institutions that provide initial and ongoing professional development can navigate transformative pressures, including evolving policy demands. These challenges present opportunities to uphold the foundational pedagogical principles that foster deep learning and deep learning and humanism. We extend an invitation to researchers, practitioners, teacher education candidates, and policymakers to engage in a fruitful dialogue that reinterprets contemporary challenges and reimagines future possibilities.



Security measures include a team of personnel on site and a comprehensive 24/7 surveillance system, ensuring a safe environment for all participants.




The Main Hall features elevators that connect all levels and accessible restrooms, promoting full participation for individuals with reduced mobility.



### PROVEN EXPERIENCE IN ORGANIZING SCIENTIFIC EVENTS

The Pontifical Catholic University of Valparaíso possesses extensive experience in organizing high-caliber conferences and seminars at both national and international levels, which will ensure effective management for the upcoming International Study Association on Teachers and Teaching Conference 2027. Recent demonstrations of this expertise include the Food for Tomorrow Conference, which convened members of the Chilean and Latin American Association of Food Science and Technology, a significant event pertinent to the life sciences. Furthermore, this capability is further illustrated by hosting scientifically significant gatherings such as the 13th Chilean Congress of Seismology and Earthquake Engineering and the 4th National Meeting of Scientific Outreach Professionals. Additionally, the University frequently accommodates crucial meetings within the higher education sector, such as those organized by the Council of Rectors of Chilean Universities (CRUCH), which necessitate exceptional logistical arrangements. This city, designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, serves as a natural amphitheater with picturesque views of the Pacific Ocean. Its vibrant hills, historical pathways, and age-old elevators create an inviting atmosphere for exploration and learning.

Moreover, the region's culinary scene stands out as a significant draw. Attendees can savor an array of gastronomic delights, from the fresh seafood of local fishing coves to the sophisticated cuisine found in the restaurants of Cerros Alegre and Concepción, offering a unique blend of tradition and innovation.

Situated a short distance from the city, the Casablanca Valley is one of Chile's premier wine-producing regions, where participants can partake in vineyard tours and tastings at esteemed wineries, enhancing their overall experience.

Valparaíso is conveniently accessible, located just 90 minutes from Santiago International Airport (SCL) via a direct route along Highway 68. Attendees benefit from various transportation options, including private shuttle services, frequent bus routes, and designated vehicle drop-off areas, thereby facilitating logistics for both national and international delegates.



# ACCOMMODATION AND AGREEMENTS: a comprehensive experience for attendees

The Pontifical Catholic University of Valparaíso maintains a comprehensive directory of partner hospitality institutions, offering a diverse range of accommodation options tailored to various preferences and budgets, all while adhering to high standards of quality and service. By the year 2025, the selection includes over 30 lodging alternatives situated between Valparaíso and Viña del Mar. Notably, certain hotels in Viña del Mar are distinguished by their amenities such as swimming pools and fitness centers, whereas in Valparaíso, accommodations are available that feature picturesque ocean or city views, along with boutique hotels that provide a limited number of rooms to ensure a more personalized guest experience.



### PASSPORT, VISA AND LENGTH OF STAY

To avoid any problems when you arrive in Chile, double-check to be sure you have a valid passport. Whether you need a visa depends on your nationality. For all nationalities, the maximum length of a tourism trip is 90 days. This following website, introduced by Chile Ministry of Foreign Affairs, is a collection of information specific to the <u>consular services</u>. If your country is not found in the list of countries exempted from entry visa into Chile, you must apply do it online <u>here</u> or a the chilean Embassy or Consulate nearest you.

### **EMBASSIES AND CONSULATES**

As you prepare for your trip, make note of the contact information for your embassy and consulates outside your country. You can go there to reissue your travel documents if they are lost and to get an array of advice (health, safety, etc.). Each diplomatic mission usually has an emergency number to be used only if absolutely necessary.



### **MONEY AND CURRENCY**

Banknotes and coins Chile has the following banknotes: 1.000; 2.000; 5.000; 10.000 and 20.000 pesos. The coins in circulation are: 10; 50; 100; 500 pesos. The coins of 1 and 5 pesos are no longer minted.

### **ATMS AND BANKS**

Banks and cash machines are found throughout the city and are widely available. Credit cards, such as Visa and MasterCard, are accepted in most hotels and restaurants.

ATMs are the easiest way to access your money in Chile.

Most banks charge you for withdrawing money from foreign cash machines; check before travelling. All the chilean banks offer reliable service.

The amount of money you can withdraw from an ATM generally depends on the conditions attached to your card; the most machines will dispense no more than \$200.000 pesos at a time.



### **CASH**

You'll need to carry some cash with you. The endless supply of small coins may be annoying, but they're handy for minor businesses taxis, tips, etc.

### **CREDIT CARDS**

Major credit cards are widely accepted in the main tourist centers. The main credit cards are MasterCard and Visa; if you plan to rely on plastic cards, the best bet is to take one of each. Take your passport with you.

### **CURRENCY**

The chilean currency is the peso. You will find notes in denominations of 1.000 pesos; 2.000 pesos; 5.000 pesos; 10.000 pesos and 20.000 pesos. The coins in circulation are: 10 pesos; 50 pesos; 100 pesos and 500 pesos. The coins of 1 and 5 pesos are no longer minted. Break big notes whenever possible.

### **CURRENCY EXCHANGE RATE**

The Peso is the currency of Chile. There are banks and currency exchange kiosks located at the airport and the city. You will have to show your passport to exchange money.

Currency exchange rates (counter rate) as of March 2022: 1 USD = 798 pesos and 1 EUR = 894 pesos approximately.

### LANGUAGE

English will be the working language of the conference.

LANGUAGE IN CHILE: The official language is spanish.

### **CHILE SAFETY**

As in any other big city, you can be a victim of robberies and/or assaults. We recommend that you do not take unnecessary risks, and that you take precautions.

In case of emergency, call the police (carabineros) at telephone 133 or go to the nearest police station (carabineros barracks). Carabineros personnel wear olive green uniforms, unlike army personnel who wear gray uniforms. The carabinieri are famous for their honesty and rectitude. We recommend going to them in case of any problematic situation.



### **VOLTAGE IN CHILE**

The voltage in Chile is generally 220 V, the frequency is 50 Hz. The plugs and sockets are of type C and L.

### **TIPPING**

Generally in restaurantes is included services charge and tip. If not, it generally corresponds to 10%. An airport or hotel porter expects between \$2.000 and \$5.000 pesos (3 to 6 Dollar approximately).


### COMMUNICATION

Spanish is the national language, in some tourist areas as well English are spoken.

### **DRESS**

You can dress in whatever way you are comfortable. Just be sure to dress in layers and warmly, as winter is in Chile between June and September, and the average temperature in Valparaíso ranges from approximately 7°C to 15°C (44°F to 59°F).





### HOUSE MUSEUM LA SEBASTIANA

La Sebastiana is one of the three houses — along with La Chascona in Santiago and the Casa de Isla Negra— that were owned by the Chilean poet Pablo Neruda. Located in Valparaíso, on Cerro Bellavista, it stands out for the beauty of its construction and its magnificent view of the port bay. Like the other two, it has been converted into a museum managed by the Neruda Foundation.

### REINA VICTORIA ELEVATOR

The Reina Victoria elevator, located in Cerro Alegre, is one of the 30 elevators that are part of the history of the city of Valparaíso. It was built in 1902 and was inaug rated on March 4, 1903. It was declared a Historic Monument on September 1, 1998.

### **CERRO CONCEPCION AND CERRO ALEGRE**

Cerro Concepcion and Cerro Alegre are located in the city of Valparaíso. Delimited from each other by Urriola street, they historically make up a unitary sector, urbanized and built largely by English and German immigrants, starting in the first half of the 19th century, in an organized and planned manner.

### PLAZA SOTOMAYOR

Considered the largest civic center in the city, as well as the main axis of the Barrio Puerto, important buildings are located there, such as the Monument to the Heroes of Iquique, where the remains of Arturo Prat lie, and the Armada de Chile Building, corresponding to the old Administration.


### PORT OF VALPARAISO

The Port of Valparaíso is the maritime terminal located in the city of the same name. It is the port with the highest arrival of passengers in the country and the second with the highest movement of containers, after San Antonio.

### ARTILLERY ELEVATOR

The Artillery elevator is one of the 30 elevators that are part of the history of the city of Valparaíso. It was inaugurated on December 29, 1892. It is located on the hill of the same name. It is currently the elevator with the highest passenger demand in the city.





### **FLOWER CLOCK**

The Flower Clock is a garden clock that is located at the foot of Cerro Castillo, in front of the Caleta Abarca.

### **OCEANIC ROCK**

The Oceanic Rock is located on the coastline between the cities of Concón and Viña del Mar. It was declared a Nature Sanctuary on March 27, 1990 by the National Monuments Council of Chile, as it constitutes an area of great geological, ecological and marine biology, which has been preserved naturally and free of contamination, which makes its preservation necessary.

### **REÑACA BEACH**

Reñaca is a town belonging to the municipality of Viña del Mar. This area is mainly tourist, and residential and is one of the most exclusive sectors of Gran Valparaíso. Characterized by its extensive beach and staggered buildings on the slopes of the hills, each year it becomes the center of summer fun on the central coast.

### **FONCK MUSEUM**

The Fonck Museum is a non-profit cultural corporation, founded on November 25,1937. It holds important collections of archaeology, ethnography and natural sciences.



### WHAT TO VISIT IN VIÑA DEL MAR?

### **QUINTA VERGARA PARK AND VERGARA PALACE**

The Vergara Palace is a heritage building located inside the Quinta Vergara park, in the city of Viña del Mar. It was declared a Historic Monument on July 31, 2008.

### **CERRO CASTILLO**

Cerro Castillo is a hill located on the south side of the mouth of the Marga Marga estuary, in the city of Viña del Mar, which houses a homonymous residential neighbourhood. Its name derives from the construction of the Callao fort or castle as the northern end of the coastal defensive bastions of Valparaíso, after the bombardment of 1866. The summer presidential palace for Chile's president is located on this hill.

### **WULFF CASTLE**


The Wulff Castle or Wülff Castle is a building located on the coastal edge of the city of Viña del Mar, between the mouth of the Marga Marga estuary and the Caleta Abarca. Since 2005 it houses the headquarters of the Heritage Unit of the Municipality of Viña del Mar. On September 20, 1995, it was declared a "National Historic Monument" by the Ministry of Education.

### VIÑA DEL MAR CASINO

The Municipal Casino of Viña del Mar whose trade name is Enjoy Viña del Mar, is a gaming casino located in the Chilean city of Viña del Mar. In the summer and during weekends national and international musicians perform here.

### **VERGARA PIER**

The Vergara Pier is an old structure for industrial use and a tourist landmark in the city of Viña del Mar. It occupies a prominent place on the coastal edge and has a number of small shops with souvenirs.



### **OTHER NEARBY PLACES**

### **CASABLANCA VINEYARDS**

The Casablanca Valley became the tenth world wine capital, joining the prestigious list made up of Bilbao-Rioja, Bordeaux, Christchurch-South Island, Cape Town, Florence, Mainz-Rheinhessen, Mendoza, Porto and Valley San Francisco-Napa.

#### HOUSE MUSEUM ISLA NEGRA

This is one of the homes of Pablo Neura, one of Chile's Nobel Price in Literature. Due to the evocative power of the objects it houses and its environment dominated by the presence of the sea, the Isla Negra house is a kind of visual and material compendium of Neruda's poetic imagery.

#### THE CAMPANA NATIONAL PARK

This national park also stands out for being a core zone of a biosphere reserve, a place of scientific interest for mining purposes, and a priority protected area for tourism development. At the top of this Hill, you can find Darwin's Rock, a place from which Chrales Darwin could see the Pacific Ocean to the west and the Andes Mountains to the East. If you like to climb this is a very good place that you can access by car.

#### TRICAO PARK


The Tricao Park is a natural reserve, located in the municipality of Santo Domingo, in the Valparaíso Region. A privileged environment designed to live recreational, sports and cultural experiences connected with nature.
